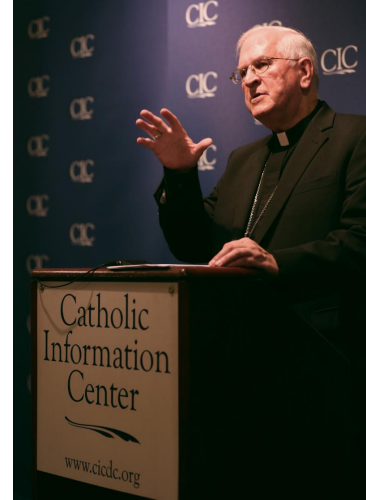

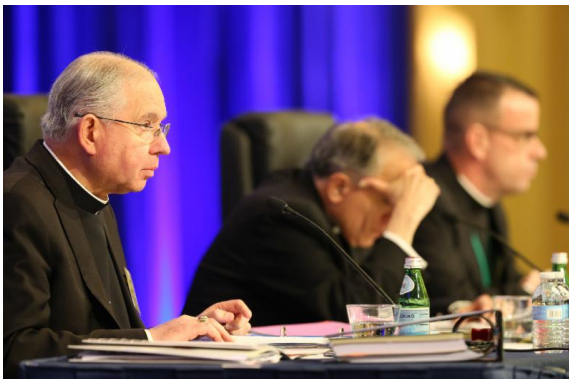
Louisville Archbishop: Religious Liberty Allows Faith in the Public Square
